# **COVID-19 Vaccine Uptake Across Staff in Care Homes Across London**

A summary of the sprint week, 15 - 21 March 2021



## **Background**

To support continued COVID-19 vaccine uptake in care homes across London, a "sprint week" was initiated on 15 March to identify opportunities to further increase uptake

Sprint week activities included:
Review of good practice and work to date
In-depth data analysis
Gathering information through surveys
Generating ideas for action with care home providers

Up to 14 March 2021 **21,746** care home staff had received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccination





The current data tells us:




### **Larger homes**

are associated with a higher proportion of residents vaccinated, but on average a lower proportion of staff vaccinated



# **Higher deprivation**

is associated with lower rates of vaccination among residents and staff

What have we learnt about what works?



1:1 meetings with someone you trust



Access to community champions



Access to NHS staff to discuss concerns



Peers getting the vaccine and sharing experience (directly and via videos and media)



Accessible information materials (e.g. podcasts, videos) shared in multiple communication channels



Confirming financial support – for travel and time to get the vaccine, for sick pay if have side effects

# **Top Tips**

### Engagement

- Partner with NHS colleagues and community groups to share up to date information with staff
- Equip managers with skills and information for 1-2-1 conversations
- Give staff access to local community champions and peer voices
- · Make time to listen to staff
- Ensure consistent approaches for day and night staff
- Lead by example across the organisation, make time for leadership and coaching

#### Access and Data

- Understand how data is recorded to ensure accuracy of staff numbers requiring first and second doses
- Support staff to **access the vaccine** where they work or where they live
- Ensure methods of booking are accessible and in multiple formats (text, phone line, online)
- Provide ongoing opportunities to staff that wanted to have more time to make a decision
- Ensure equality of access for night and day staff
